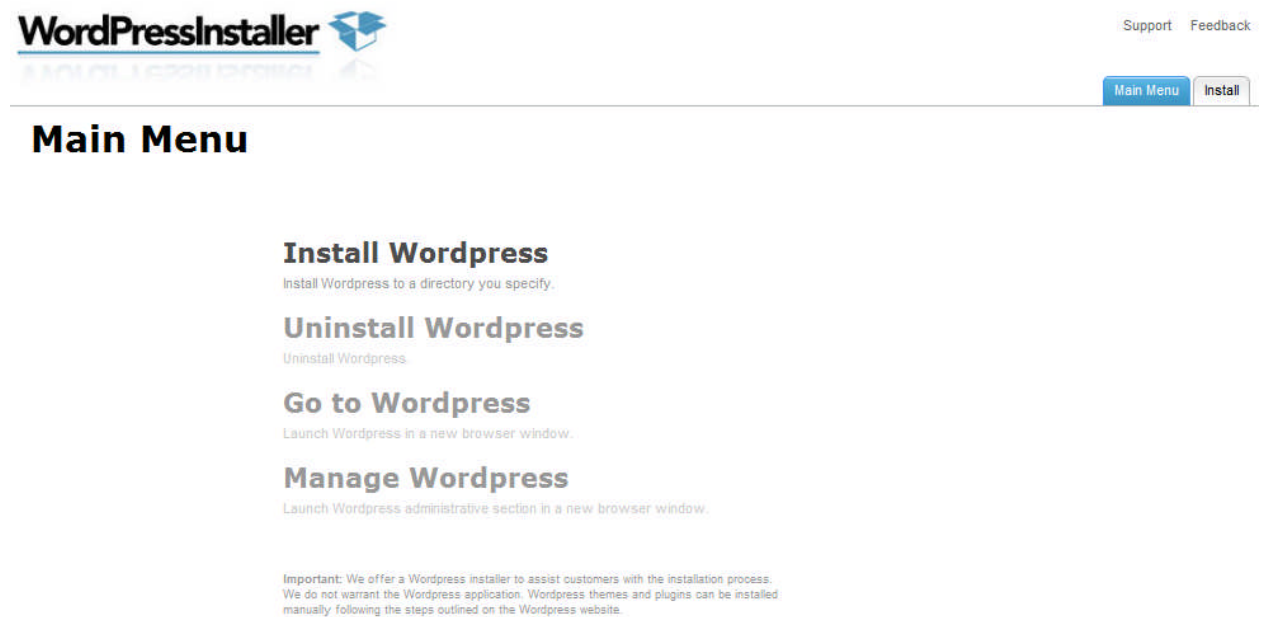
1 Introduction

WordPress is an easy-to-use weblog system, providing numerous features like categories, ratings, as well as plugins installation. This installer application will easily install the WordPress tool to a directory that you specify within your web services account.

TO LAUNCH WORDPRESS INSTALLER:

- Click on the **WordPress Installer icon**.

The application opens in a new window.



1.1 Navigation

The main menu is located on the top right corner of WordPress Installer:


- **Main Menu:** links you to the Main Page of WordPress Installer
- **Install Wordpress:** links you to the page where you can start installing this application
- **Uninstall Wordpress:** links you to the page where you can uninstall this application
- **Go To Wordpress:** links you to the page where you can access this application and start using it after installing it.
- **Manage Wordpress:** links you to the page where you can manage this application
- **Support:** opens online help files for WordPress Installer in a new window
- **Feedback:** allows you to send feedback concerning WordPress Installer

2 Install

Install Wordpress allows you to install wordpress to a directory you specify.

TO INSTALL WORDPRESS:

1. Click **Install Wordpress**.
2. Complete the following:

- **Database User** – select a database user

Note: Your administrator username has to be longer than 3 characters and your password must be longer than 5 characters.

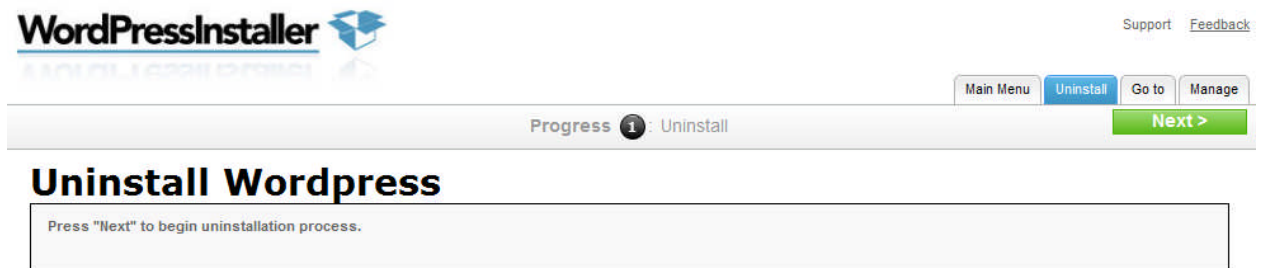
3. Click **Next**.

3 Uninstall

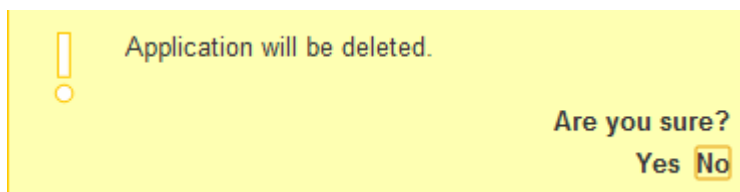
Uninstall Wordpress allows you to uninstall wordpress from your website.

To UNINSTALL WORDPRESS:

1. Click **Uninstall Wordpress**.



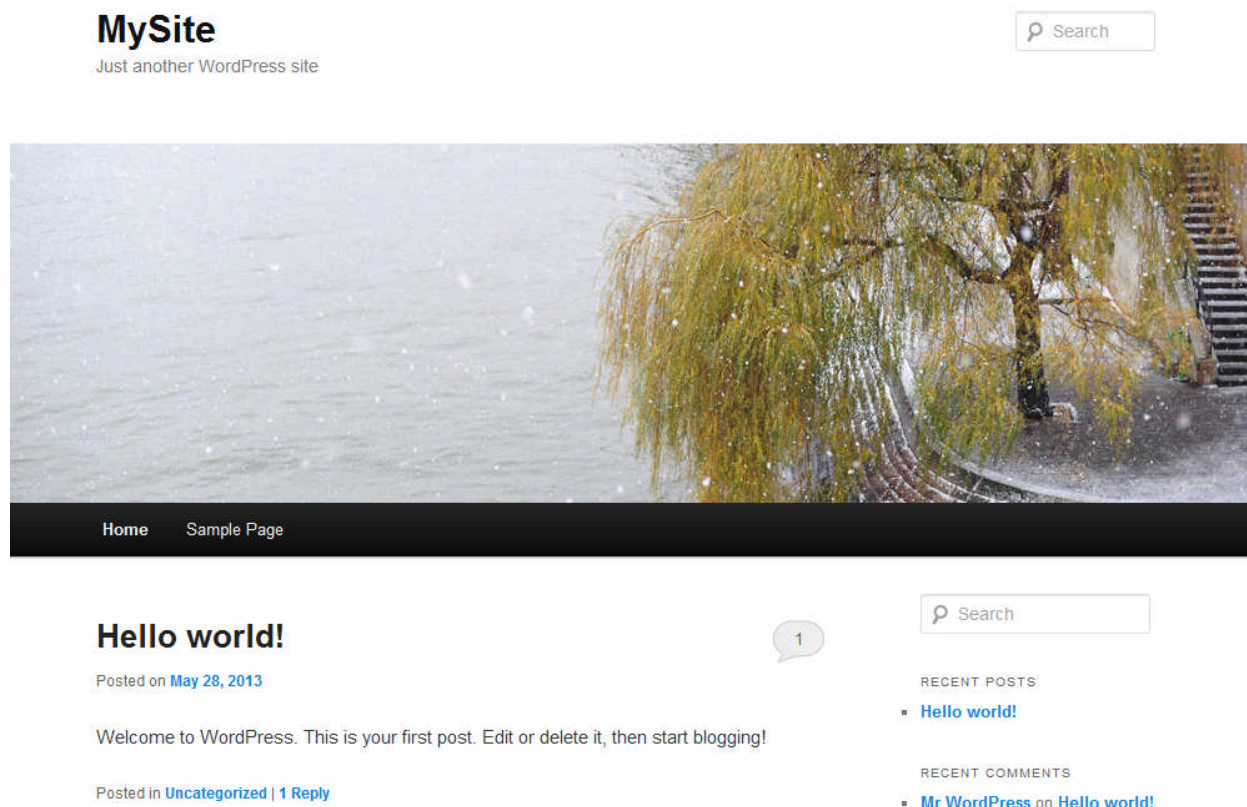
2. Click **Next**.

Go to Wordpress launches your wordpress website in the new window.




5 Manage

Manage Wordpress allows you to manage your website using the backend. You will have to login with your administrative credentials that you created when installing this applications.
